The architect was keen to choose the two mixes of Italian Porphyry so we took a delegation from Glasgow Council to the Quarry in Trento where they were able to see the material been quarried and cut.

The Kerbs channels and ramps were supplied in Scottish Whin Stone quarried and cut locally to match existing material. Feature slabs were supplied in Finnish granite at the front door of the Cathedral where we supplied a flag carved with the coat of arms.
